









School News.....Read about the exciting activities each phase group has been up to over the past week...

Foundation

**Nursery** We have been doing science experiments in Nursery. We have been very busy, *predicting*, *testing*, *recording*, *observing*, *evaluating*, *analysing*, *discovering* and many more skills including....**patience!** 

The experiments included exploring with magnets, making slime, experimenting with skittles and water and waterproof and non-waterproof materials. The children were full of smiles, laughter, ideas and conversation as we carried out the experiments. The experiments allowed for lots of conversation and allowed the children to develop their questioning skills when looking at how and why things happen.

In maths we learned about heavy and light objects. We then used those objects to learn about floating and sinking.

Reception This week, the children had a visit from Freshwater Theatre Company. They went on a Story Hunt, collecting clues to tell a space story. The children really enjoyed the session. There have been many strange encounters going on this week, we seem to have been invaded by aliens! The children read the text 'Aliens Love Underpants' and role played the story in Forest school. We are so impressed with the children's knowledge of space and have loved hearing them share their Working Together ideas. The children used fruit to learn about the planets in our solar system and their distance from the sun, we also compared their size and used ordinal numbers to discuss how far away from the sun they were. We have used these facts to produce a planet fact sheet. Next week, we will continue to learn about space and will have the opportunity to visit the space domes.

#### Key Stage One...

Year 1 This week Year 1 have watched an animation of the story "The Way Back Home" to support our Space theme. We explored the two characters in the book and the children worked hard to develop their skills when using inverted commas to write a conversation between the alien and the boy. In Maths, we have begun to think about symmetry. The children have identified symmetrical and non-symmetrical objects and have started to explain their reasons.

Next week we shall look at poetry and fractions of shapes. Please note that your children have brought a school trip letter home this week, your reply slips would be greatly received!

Year 2 We've completed our Space topic and the children now have better understanding of the moon. We hope they have enjoyed using their telescopes to look at the phases of the moon, which we have reinforced in class. In Literacy we have gone suffix mad, identifying them in reading and using them in writing. See if your child can spot them and use them in speech. We have moved on to our new story The Velveteen Rabbit and we had a very successful Circle Time where we focused on the beginning of the story and the emotions of the characters. In maths we have learnt about time (quarter to and quarter past) and used estimation and scales to check weight. Next week we will be preparing for the Tower of London trip (topic work), learning about fractions of shape and number and continuing with character profiles linked to our core book.

#### **Key Stage Two**

Year 3 Wow, where has the week gone? Year 3 have not only managed to learn about 'time' in maths and finish their prequel stories in Literacy but they have also started rehearsing for our Easter production too! We are really looking forward to further rehearsals next week; witnessing each child having a moment to shine on stage. We will be learning about co-ordinates in maths next week and helping children to learn through a lot of practical activities whilst focusing on 'writing for a purpose' in literacy. Have a great weekend!

Year 4 This week, Year 4 had a fantastic day out in the beautiful sunshine visiting the Royal Observatory in Greenwich. The children watched a fascinating 'Final Frontier' show all about our Solar System and what lies further afield. We even had time to take in the beautiful view and recreate this using our sketching skills. Year 4 were also complimented on their exemplary behaviour by various member of the public on their trip so very well done! Linking to our trip, Year 4 have also started their time learning in Maths. They have been looking at analogue and digital clocks, revising how to read them and convert between the two. In Literacy, we have finally published our prequels to the Iron Man! The children worked extremely hard to publish their writing and they also used their art and ICT skills to create a front cover and a blurb for their books.

Next week, the children will be continuing their time learning in Maths and in English, we will be exploring the idea of aliens invading Earth and how it would feel to be an outsider.

Year 5 After weeks of anticipation and practise a number of Year 5 children took part in an amazing dance show at Crown Woods School. Their performance did us proud and the children had an incredible experience. Well done!

Back in the classroom we analysed the features of a newspaper report and got to interview an incredible astronaut who has actually been to Mars (or was it really Mr Hook?) In Maths, the children showed great resilience as they handled complex division using the long division method. The children also found themselves participating in astronaut training devised by NASA! The 'Train like an Astronaut' activities were modelled after the real-life physical requirements of humans travelling in space and the children worked in teams to face challenges based on physical fitness and spatial awareness.

Next week in Literacy we will be learning how voice and tense are used to write newspaper articles and in Maths we will be learning the order of operations using BIDMAS. Have a wonderful weekend!

Year 6 In Year 6 the children have continued to work extremely hard, using their Mindfulness skills to approach their SATs revision maturely and effectively. In Maths we have been revising units of measure and knowing how to convert between them. Literacy has seen us developing our use of PEE (Point, Evidence, Explain) when answering questions that contain several marks. We were so thrilled to see more sunshine this week and so took the opportunity to have a game of football rounders - practising the skills that are needed in all invasion games! A big well done to all of our Year 6 children who took part in the Crown Woods Dance Production yesterday, and a big thank you to all for coming to Parents' Evening; we really value your continued support and partnership! Have a wonderful weekend.
