Foundation Stage

Nursery This week we have been busy rehearsing for our Christmas Nativity; the children have been to practise in the hall and have loved learning our songs and actions in class. Our main focus this week was using our imagination and understanding when were are at different areas, how we can pretend to be different things or use objects and pretend they are something else. Some children were really good at pretending to be doctors and nurses in the Hospital and some children were using their imagination in the sand, making ice creams and cakes. We have also looked at number, counting, counting out objects and number recognition. The children have also been helping to change our Hospital into a new role play area linked to Winter, they enjoyed helping decorate and make things for the 'Winter Wonderland'. We hope to see lots of you at our performance on Friday, have a lovely weekend.

Reception As we approach the end of term, we have been reviewing the sounds that we have learnt so far. In your child's phonic books this week it will show you any sounds that they may need a little support with. We have also had a wonderful first trip to the church. The children were extremely well behaved and represented our school very well. We spent time looking around the church, discussing key features that were on our worksheet to find. We have also spent time this week practicing our stage directions, lines and songs for our Nativity (Friday 13th December). Key Stage One...

Year 1 This week we have been thinking about what we have achieved whilst we have been in Year One. We then wrote a letter to Father Christmas, or a family member, to tell them about our achievements and how we are going to celebrate this. We are feeling very proud of ourselves! In Maths we have been thinking about 'more than >', 'less than <' 'and equal to'. We have had lots of fun with Connie the Crocodile who always eats the bigger number. Our trip to the church was a lovely way of bringing to life our RE learning. We listened to the Christmas story and explored the church to find the features and objects that we had learnt about in class. Thank you for your support with our trip. Thank you to all of you who brought resources in for us to make our crackers, the children had great fun designing, making them and enjoying them with their Christmas dinner. We certainly enjoyed hearing the jokes the children created. Next week we will be busy with singing and rehearsals as well as writing letters to Father Christmas and making some festive cards. Key Stage Two ...

Year 3 This week we have begun to develop our multiplication skills focusing on 3s and 5s. The children have created equal groups, practiced multiplication through repeated addition and considered division in the form of arrays. We look forward to putting these skills to use in some reasoning and problem-solving challenges next week. In English the children have been introduced to the character of 'Charlotte' in Charlotte's Web and had a go at writing from her perspective. They have also had the opportunity to write predictions about what they think might happen next in the story based on what they already know. We are excited to be looking at persuasive writing techniques linked to the story

next week. In History, the children have learnt all about The National Maritime Museum, plotting important dates in its history onto a timeline and adding extra information. Can your child remember which historical figure's outfit is kept there? The children have loved designing and producing their own Christmas crackers in DT this week and had a lot of fun pulling them during our fantastic Christmas dinner!

Year 4 have had a busy week designing and creating their Christmas crackers for our Christmas dinner today. The D.T project promoted lots of creativity, resilience and opportunities for collaborative working. In Maths, the children are continuing to develop their knowledge and skills of times tables; with a particular focus on the 6s, 7s and 9s. The children have learnt how to apply their knowledge of these times tables to quickly calculate the answers to a 1-digit number multiplied by 2- and 3-digit numbers. Within Literacy, the children have learnt the Roman story 'Romulus and Remus'. They have explored the characters, the moral of the story and have re-enacted their own versions through role play. We shall continue this story into next week. Have a lovely weekend!

Year 5 This week in maths we have continued to work out the perimeter and area of rectilinear and compound shapes in unusual and real-life contexts. Towards the end of this week, we have been recapping all we have learned this term in preparation for a maths assessment next week. In English, we have been drafting and editing to improve our non-chronological reports on Lego. We have also been busy creating recyclable Christmas crackers in our DT lessons which included creating festive jokes and origami toys which were placed inside. In Geography, we have been looking in greater depth at the human impact on our oceans and seas; and discussing ways in which we can help our environment. Have a wonderful weekend!

Year 6 have continued to develop their understanding of adding and subtracting mixed number and improper fractions in a variety of different contexts. We have been very impressed with the children's attitudes and focus towards their learning. Next week we will revise our knowledge of multiplying and dividing fractions. Our English lessons have focused on the theme of winter and how we use precise language for effect to create a vivid image in the reader's mind. Our winter writing will also continue next week. We have started to learn our Christmas songs in earnest for our forthcoming performance at the Methodist Church in Chislehurst, the children are really excited to perform this for you. Have a lovely weekend.
